# ADDITIONAL OSCS FOR WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

## 2076. DR. ASHOK KUMAR MITTAL:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has approved the proposal for setting up of 180 additional One Stop Centres (OSCs) for women empowerment across the country during 2022;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with number of the said centres established till date, State- wise including Punjab;
- (c) the details of fund allocated under OSCs during the last three years, State-wise/UT-wise including Punjab;
- (d) whether any specific services are being provided to women in the said centres and if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the number of women benefited under the said scheme so far, State-wise including Punjab?

# ANSWER

# MINISTER OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

(a) to (e): The scheme of OSC is implemented with effect from 1st April 2015 to provide integrated support and assistance to women affected by violence and in distress, both in private and public spaces under one roof and provide an integrated range of services including medical aid, legal aid and advice, temporary shelter, police assistance, psycho-social counselling to needy women. The setting up of OSCs from the year 2015 onward, at district level, has provided a dedicated platform to women affected by violence and who are in distress to get necessary help and assistance, which was not available earlier.

The Government of India has launched "Mission Shakti" - integrated women empowerment programme, as umbrella scheme for safety, security and empowerment of women for implementation during the 15th Finance Commission period from 2021-22 to 2025-26. The "Mission Shakti" consists of two sub-schemes – 'Sambal' and 'Samarthya'. The One Stop Centre (OSC) is a component of 'Sambal' sub-scheme under umbrella scheme of "Mission Shakti. Based on the encouraging results of this initiative and benefits to women, the Government has decided to set up 300 more OSCs, in phased manner based on proposals received from States/ UTs, in the districts having higher rate of crime against women or having bigger geographical area, preferably in Aspirational districts under 'Mission Shakti', during the 15th Finance Commission Period (2021-22 to 2025-26).

Presently, 758 OSCs (including 23 in Punjab) have been approved for 734 districts across the country, out of which 708 OSCs (including 22 OSCs in Punjab) have been operationalized in 35 States/ UTs that have assisted over 5.40 lakh women till March, 2022.
